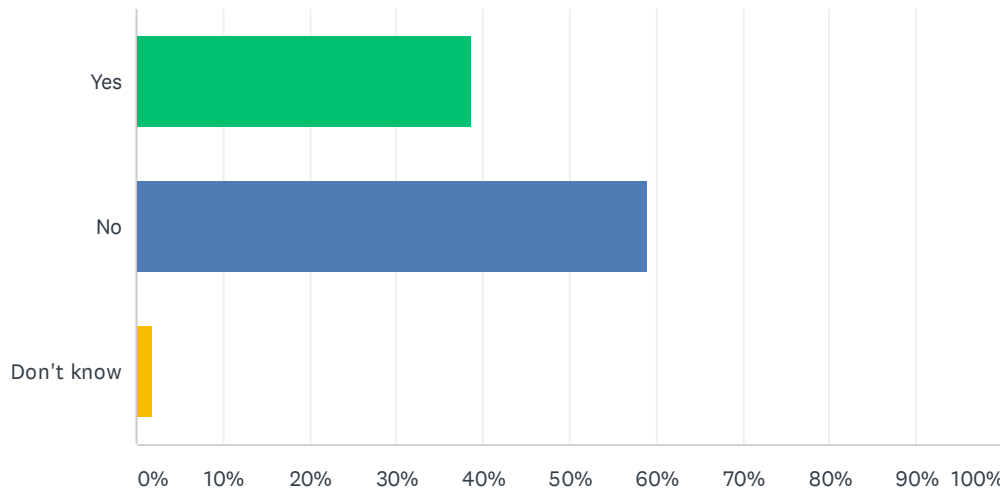


Q2 Has your organization experienced any impacts due to COVID-19?
